**TRAINING:** Election judges must successfully complete necessary training.

**TIME OFF FROM WORK:** State Statute provides that people who are selected to be election judges may take time off from work without loss of pay. A prospective judge must give his or her employer at least 20 days written notice and a certificate from the City Clerk that shows the hours the person will work and rate of pay. The employer may deduct what the person receives for being an election judge from his or her salary for the hours that overlap. (Please note that federal agencies are not required to comply with this state law.)
